Exports are a Vital Part of Illinois' Economy^A

- Preliminary Illinois exports totaled over \$65.90 billion in 2021. The preliminary agricultural adjusted figure for 2021 is \$70.57 billion.^c
- Since 2009, Illinois exports have increased by \$24.28 billion, or 58.3%
- Illinois is the largest exporting state in the Midwest and the 4th largest in the nation, a record, using agricultural adjusted figures provided by Census Bureau/ USDA cash receipts.c
- 20 out of top 20 export industries increased 2020 to 2021
- 18 out of top 20 export industries increased 2009 to 2021
- Top 10 Illinois export industries have seen gains since 2009
- 9 of the top 10 Illinois export partner countries have seen gains since 2009
- Export activities support over 800K jobs in Illinois.^B

- Illinois exports to European Union 27 totaled \$9.92 billion in 2021, a 51.2% increase since 2009. Top 5 export partners are Germany, Netherlands, Belgium, Ireland, and France
- Illinois ranks 5th among the 50 U.S. states in exports to European Union 27
- Illinois imports from European Union 27 totaled \$31.68 billion in 2021, a 167.3% increase since 2009. Top 5 import partners are Netherlands, Germany, Italy, Ireland, France
- Illinois ranks 4th among the 50 U.S. states in imports from European Union 27
